# **Texas Intellectual Property Law Foundation Created to Promote IP Law in Texas By Craig Stone**




On November 23, 2020, the founding members of the Texas Intellectual Property Law Foundation ("Foundation") conducted their first official meeting by teleconference.

The Foundation is a newly created non-profit whose aim is to promote the progress of intellectual property law in Texas by undertaking initiatives and activities such as submitting amicus briefs, advocating for legislative changes in IP law, and awarding diversity scholarships.

The formation of the Foundation was spearheaded by its newly-elected officers, Herb Hammond (President), Joe Cleveland (Treasurer) and Craig Stone (Secretary). Other founding members include Shannon Bates, Scott Breedlove, Leon Carter, Kirby Drake, Hilda Galvan, Timothy Hudson, Sharon Israel, Devika Kornbacher, William LaFuze, Mike Lockler, Kat Li, Leisa Talbert Peschel, Lou Pirkey, Derrick Pizarro, Molly Richard, Jerry Selinger and Bruce Sostek.

The Foundation is also undertaking an initiative related to the upcoming 75th Anniversary of the Lanham Act. The anniversary will be officially celebrated at the State Bar of Texas Annual Meeting (June 17-18, 2021) in Fort Worth, where the legislation's namesake, Fritz Lanham served as a Congressman in the 12th District from 1931 – 1946. The list of honored guests will be comprised of various dignitaries and officials from the state as well as David Gooder, the USPTO's Commissioner of Trademarks, who will be delivering the keynote address at a dinner to be announced.

The IP Section and Foundation are also collaborating with the USPTO to contribute funding and create museum-quality displays featuring Lanham. These displays will debut at the Bar's Annual Meeting and will then embark on a traveling roadshow, being shown at the PTO's Regional Offices. The Lanham displays will ultimately travel to Washington D.C. where the materials will be permanently exhibited in the National Inventors Hall of Fame.



Additionally, a book, authored by Joe Cleveland, celebrating Lanham's life and accomplishments, has been licensed to the Foundation on a royalty-free basis. Proceeds from book sales will be used to fundraise for scholarships that will be awarded to students and individuals showing a keen interest in an intellectual property career. Diversity is expected to be a key factor when awarding the scholarships. ## **Lester Lee Hewitt (March 11, 1942 – October 24, 2020)**



It is with the saddest of hearts that we announce the passing of Les Hewitt, a pillar of the Houston IP Community, past president of HIPLA, and founding Master of the Bench Member of the Atlas IP Inn of Court.

Les' Houston IP roots ran deep. He received both his B.S. in Mechanical Engineering and his J.D. from the University of Houston. He worked as a patent examiner at the USPTO prior to entering private practice. He was a name partner at Pravel, Hewitt, Kimball & Krieger (formerly Pravel, Gambrell, Hewitt, Kimball & Krieger), which merged into Akin Gump in 1999. He left Akin Gump to start his own IP law practice in 2013.

But Les' most important professional roots were those planted in the hearts and minds of those he worked with, worked against, and mentored throughout his long and successful career. He always exhibited the most pleasant of attitudes, was always joyful and willing to help, and consistently exhibited the highest standards of professionalism in the practice of law. ## **Greetings from the USPTO Patent Pro Bono Team!**

The USPTO is seeking additional volunteers for the Patent Pro Bono Program. Section members who are patent practitioners are uniquely positioned to help under-resourced inventors and small businesses file and prosecute patent applications. Patent practitioners can volunteer through their local patent pro bono program.

Please see <a href="http://talarts.org/inventors/">http://talarts.org/inventors/</a>, <a href="www.uspto.gov/probonopatents">www.uspto.gov/probonopatents</a>, or <a href="www.uspto.gov">www.uspto.gov</a> for more information on how to volunteer. The local program screens applicants using criteria that include: (1) household income; (2) knowledge of the patent system; and (3) possession of an actual invention (not merely an idea) to ensure that each inventor or small business is a good candidate for assistance.

Last year, over 80 patent practitioners volunteered 50 or more hours on patent pro bono programs, and over 20 law firms were recognized for their practitioners' participation. The USPTO continues to offer achievement certificates to practitioners, law firms, and corporations that provide the requisite hours of patent pro bono service in 2019. Certificates are signed by Commissioner for Patents, Drew Hirshfeld, and Deputy General Counsel and Director for the Office of Enrollment and Discipline, Will Covey. Additionally, certificate recipients are listed on the USPTO website if they so choose.

Section members are encouraged to take advantage of these opportunities to help financially under-resourced inventors and small businesses engage in our innovation economy.
